Crystal found hope and stability through a holistic mental health program supported by United Way East Ontario.

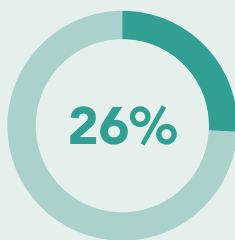

1 in 3 students surveyed in Ottawa and rural East Ontario wanted mental health supports **but did not seek them out.**



26% of people in Ontario reported their mental health as **poor or fair.**



1 in 5 grade 7-12 students in Ottawa and rural East Ontario are using **non-medical opioids.**
